

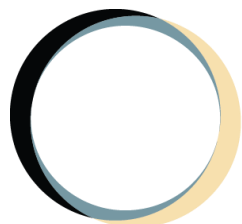

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About

The National Citizen Survey™ (The NCS™) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. Communities conducting The NCS can choose from a number of optional services to customize the reporting of survey results. Ann Arbor’s Comparisons by Demographic Subgroups is part of a larger project for the City and additional reports are available under separate cover. This report discusses differences in opinion of survey respondents by age, sex, race/ethnicity, annual household income and housing tenure (Housing tenure).

Understanding the Tables

For most of the questions, one number appears for each question. Responses have been summarized to show only the proportion of respondents giving a certain answer; for example, the percent of respondents who rated the quality of life as “excellent” or “good,” or the percent of respondents who participated in an activity at least once. It should be noted that when a table that does include all responses (not a single number) for a question that only permitted a single response does not total to exactly 100%, it is due to the common practice of percentages being rounded to the nearest whole number.

The subgroup comparison tables contain the crosstabulations of survey questions by selected respondent characteristics. Chi-square or ANOVA tests of significance were applied to these breakdowns of survey questions. A “p-value” of 0.05 or less indicates that there is less than a 5% probability that differences observed between groups are due to chance; or in other words, a greater than 95% probability that the differences observed in the selected categories of the sample represent “real” differences among those populations. As subgroups vary in size and each group (and each comparison to another group) has a unique margin of error, statistical testing is used to determine whether differences between subgroups are statistically significant. Statistical testing was not performed on multiple response questions.

Each column in the following tables is labeled with a letter for each subgroup being compared. The “Overall” column, which shows the ratings for all respondents, also has a column designation of “(A)”, but no statistical tests were done for the overall rating.

For each pair of subgroups ratings within a row (a single question item) that has a statistically significant difference, an upper case letter denoting significance is shown in the cell with the larger column proportion. The letter denotes the subgroup with the smaller column proportion from which it is statistically different. Subgroups that have no upper case letter denotation in their column and that are also not referred to in any other column were not statistically different.

For example, in Table A below, respondents age 55 and over (C) gave significantly higher rating to the overall quality of life than those age 18 to 34 (A) and 35 to 54 (B), as denoted by the “A B” listed in the cell of the ratings for those 55+. This was also true of women (A) over men (B); people who were white alone, not Hispanic (A) over those who were Hispanic and/or other race (B); homeowners (B) over renters (A); and those living in detached housing (A) over those living in attached housing (B).

Findings

Notable differences between demographic subgroups included the following:

- Younger Ann Arbor residents (18-34) were more likely to praise the livability of the community compared to those that were middle aged (35-54), including the overall quality of life in the city, the community as a place to live and the appearance of Ann Arbor. They also gave higher ratings to Natural Environment-related aspects, such as air quality and cleanliness of the city. Participants who were white were more likely to applaud measures of the Economy (e.g., shopping opportunities and vibrant downtown/commercial areas), while residents who were Black/African American felt less positively about opportunities to participate in community matters, neighborliness of Ann Arbor citizens and the openness and acceptance of the community toward people of diverse backgrounds. Those individuals whose annual household income was less than \$50,000 annually tended to give lower marks to aspects of Recreation and Wellness than those with higher incomes.
- Residents who were younger (18-34) and renters were more likely to rate government performance in Ann Arbor as excellent or good, including the overall services provided by the City, the value of services for taxes paid and the City welcoming citizen involvement, acting in the best interest of the community and being honest, among others. These groups also assessed Built Environment services (e.g., storm drainage, code enforcement) higher than their counterparts.
- Asian/Asian Indian/Pacific Islander residents praised many Natural Environment-related services, such as preservation of natural areas and open space, but were less pleased with City parks.
- Survey respondents under the age of 55 reported higher levels of participation in alternative modes of transportation, using public libraries, visiting parks and attending City-sponsored events. Conversely, younger community members indicated they were less likely to engage in the community and also placed lower importance on a number of community focus areas, such as safety, health and wellness, education and enrichment and economic health.
- Though all age groups were equally as likely to have had contact with the Ann Arbor police department in the 12 months prior to the survey, older respondents (55+) that did have contact awarded higher marks to police officer conduct than their younger counterparts. White survey participants were also more likely to assign excellent or good scores to officer conduct measurements compared to other residents.

If there is a significant difference between one or more demographic groups, there will be an upper case letter to denote where there is a difference. For example, residents aged 55 and older awarded less positive ratings for Ann Arbor as a place to raise children than those who were 18-34 or 35-54, but there were no differences between the 18-34 and 35-54 groups. However, respondents aged 18-34 and residents who identified as Asian/Asian Indian/Pacific Islander gave higher scores to the overall appearance than either of the other two groups. If no letter is found, then there are no significant differences between residents based on demographics (e.g. ratings for their neighborhood as a place to live between age and race groups).
