

**ANN ARBOR CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
REGULAR SESSION - JANUARY 3, 2000**

The regular session of the Ann Arbor City Council was called to order at 7:34 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chamber by Mayor Ingrid B. Sheldon.

Council stood for a moment of silence.

Mayor Sheldon led Council in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY - RESERVED TIME

DAMIAN FARRELL - DEAN=S CRESCENT

Damian Farrell, 4930 High Meadow Ln., of Damian Farrell Design Group, representing the petitioner of the proposed Dean=s Crescent project, stated that 16 parking spaces will be provided on the site, that the petitioner will make a contribution to the Ann Arbor Housing Trust Fund in lieu of including affordable housing units in the project, and that the creative use of this site will provide needed housing opportunities in the campus area.

ANDREA KEVRICK - DEAN=S CRESCENT

Andrea Kevrick, 150 S. Fifth Ave., landscape architect for the proposed Dean=s Crescent project, stated that no landmark trees exist on the site, that an investigation will be done on moving the more significant trees, and that a long green strip on the site is planned to increase the life expectancy of the trees.

RICK MC HUGH - LIVING WAGE

Rick McHugh, 3788 E. Delhi Rd., representing the Washtenaw Coalition for a Living Wage, thanked Council for considering the living wage proposal. He stated that the minimum wage, which has not kept up with the poverty level or cost of living, does not enable a household to have an acceptable standard of living. Mr. McHugh reported that the Coalition is proposing a \$10.00/hr. minimum wage or an \$8.50/hr. minimum wage for employees who receive health care benefits.

JOHN MARTIN - LIVING WAGE

John Martin, 2572 Walnut Rd., former director of Catholic Social Services, spoke in favor of the proposed living wage ordinance. He expressed concern that the need for emergency food has grown in the community because many people in low-paying jobs do not have enough money for food after paying other monthly expenses. Mr. Martin stated that poverty over time leads to community disintegration, and that anything Council can do to boost the minimum wage would help the situation.

JESSE DE WITT - LIVING WAGE

Jesse DeWitt, 2968 Leslie Park Cir., reported that the religious community supports the proposed living wage ordinance and believes it to be important for the City. He stated that living wages would help to assure social and economic benefits for the community as a whole and a supportive environment for employers who try to maintain fair wages. Mr. DeWitt further stated that a living wage ordinance would support a positive move toward overcoming economic inequalities

ALAN FELDT - DEAN=S CRESCENT

Alan Feldt, 136 Gralake Ave., retired professor of urban planning and former Planning Commission Member, spoke in support of the proposed Dean=s Crescent PUD zoning. He stated that Ann Arbor needs higher density, more pedestrian access and more people living downtown and near campus to grow and evolve as a strong urban center. He reported that the Dean=s Crescent proposal fits the bill because it is an attractive building that provides residences near campus. Mr. Feldt urged the City to change its outdated ordinances to accommodate such projects.

ALAN HABER - TOWN MEETING

Alan Haber, 531 Third St., representing the Coalition for the Abolition of Nuclear Weapons, asked Council to consider holding town meetings to provide an opportunity for citizens to bring forth the questions that divide the community and to find the issues around which everyone can rally for a greater unity.

Whereas, It is necessary to replace the existing disinfection system at the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) with an ultra violet (UV) disinfection system;

Whereas, By resolution number R-2-1-99, approved January 4, 1999, Council authorized a professional services agreement with Greeley and Hansen for design of UV disinfection facilities;

Whereas, Greeley and Hansen submitted a proposal in the amount of \$288,572.00 to provide engineering services for the construction and post construction start-up of the UV disinfection system;

Whereas, On April 22, 1999, Greeley and Hansen received Human Resources approval; and

Whereas, Council approved \$260,000.00 for construction engineering services and \$230,000.00 for contingencies for the project by resolution number R-655-12-99 on December 20, 1999;

RESOLVED, That Council approve an amendment to the professional services agreement with Greeley and Hansen in the amount of \$288,572.00 to provide engineering services for the construction and post construction start-up of the UV disinfection system at the WWTP;

Whereas, The replacement vehicles are available through the Macomb County Cooperative Purchasing Program;

Whereas, Signature Ford of Perry, Michigan, 48872, is the vendor supplying trucks through the Macomb County Cooperative Purchasing Program and the plows through the Oakland County Cooperative Purchasing Program; and

Whereas, Signature Ford of Perry, Michigan, 48872, has received Human Resources approval on February 4, 1999;
