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PUBLIC FORUM WILL REVIEW THE PROPOSED COURT-POLICE BUILDING DESIGN

Forum takes place Wednesday, April 30, 2008, at 6:30 p.m.

ANN ARBOR, Mich., April 2, 2008 — With the county's lease-expiration deadline on the horizon for the 15th District Court, the City of Ann Arbor is making progress on its plans for a building to house the court as well as the police department. Citizens are invited to attend a public forum Wednesday, April 30, 2008, 6:30 – 8 p.m. to review the proposed court-police building design. The forum takes place at City Hall in the second floor City Council chambers. Project architects and designers will review the revised design, discuss the project status and answer questions. The proposed project site is on the west side of the current Guy C. Larcom Jr. Municipal Center property.

Persons with disabilities are encouraged to participate in public meetings.
