DON'T JUST RECYCLE — RECYCLE RIGHT

ANN ARBOR, Mich., Feb. 18, 2008 — Ann Arbor residents are way ahead of the curve when it comes to recycling. Over 90 percent of households in the city are recycling on a regular basis, and Ann Arborites are recycling or composting 50 percent of their household waste. That's double the national average!

Have you ever stopped to think about where your recyclables go once they leave your curb? And for the 10 percent of yet-to-be recyclers, how can you tell what is recyclable and how to dispose of it for proper collection?

The City of Ann Arbor's Community Television Network has produced an informative program to explore the ins and outs of recycling in Ann Arbor. **"Recycle Right"** explains what can be recycled, how to recycle, and what happens to your recyclable waste when it leaves your curb. The program premieres **Saturday, Feb. 23, at 8:30 p.m.** on CitiTV Channel 19 (on the Comcast Cable system); and replays at the following times: Sunday, Feb. 24 at 10:45 a.m. and 11 p.m.; Tuesday, Feb. 26 at 9:30 p.m.; Thursday, Feb. 28 at 2:30 p.m.; Saturday, March 1 at 8:10 p.m.; Sunday, March 2 at 8 p.m.; Tuesday, March 4 at noon; Wednesday, March 5 at 3 p.m.; and Friday, March 7 at 9:30 p.m.
