Safety Update Bicycle and Motorcycle Safety

May is both *National Bike Month and Motorcycle Safety Month*. Ann Arbor has over 79 miles of bike lanes with a growing number of protected lanes. May weather makes it a great time for biking, whether it be for commuting or just for fun. While many vehicles today have driver assistance features to help prevent accidents, drivers must be careful to maintain situational awareness. Be sure to:

- LEAVE ROOM
- COMMUNICATE

Ann Arbor's Safe Passing ordinance requires drivers to maintain at least five feet of distance when passing a bicyclist. Sharing the road responsibly keeps everyone safer. - Ann Arbor's New Green Business Challenge. Ann Arbor's Office of Sustainability and Innovations and Ann Arbor SPARK are delighted to announce a new Ann Arbor Green Business Challenge! Join us for an exciting morning as we kick off the launch of the Ann Arbor Green Business Challenge (A2 GBC)! Designed to bring together local businesses and stakeholders, this event aims to inspire, inform, and connect individuals interested in sustainable business practices. - Hot off the Press: **THE A²ZERO HOME ENERGY ADVISOR** is live! The A²ZERO Home Energy Advisor service will be launching in the days to come. This free service will help residents obtain free home energy assessments, plan projects, connect to contractors and rebates, and get customized "Path to Zero" decarbonization plans. The service will be open to all homeowners and renters in Ann Arbor.
- **Gas Leaf Blower Phase-Out.** In December 2023, Ann Arbor City Council passed new restrictions on the use of gas-powered leaf blowers within Ann Arbor city limits. Beginning this year, the use of gas-powered leaf blowers will be prohibited in Ann Arbor from June 1st to September 30th. Beginning January 1st, 2028, the use of gas-powered leaf blowers will be prohibited all year in Ann Arbor. The purpose of this ordinance is to protect the peace, health, safety, and welfare of persons in Ann Arbor as well as to promote the City's sustainability goals by reducing noise, air pollution, greenhouse gas emissions, and other negative effects of gas leaf blowers. If you are interested in learning more about the ordinance, alternatives to gas leaf blowers, how to sustainably dispose of gas leaf blowers, or sustainable lawn care, we recommend taking a look at our gas leaf blower phase-out and pollinator aware lawn care

FY2025 Budget Process. The City of Ann Arbor Fiscal year 2025 begins July 1, 2024, and ends June 30, 2025. City Council members can only adopt one fiscal year at a time, even though the city plans for multi-year budgets.

Budget timeline:

- April: In accordance with City Charter, the city administrator's recommended fiscal year 2025 budget was submitted to City Council in April. City Council members can only adopt one fiscal year at a time even though the city plans for multi-year budgets.
- May: City Council, with at least seven affirmative votes, will vote to adopt the budget at its meeting on May 20.
