Overview

An electronic meeting through Zoom was held to provide a brief overview of the Traffic Calming process, to discuss the Preliminary Plan specific to Worden Avenue between Jackson Avenue and Dexter Avenue as well as modifications to the plan. Refer to the Traffic Calming Guidebook available at a2gov.org/TrafficCalming for additional information on the Traffic Calming process. Considering the Preliminary Plan shared at Meeting #2, community feedback, street conditions, utility locations, and engineering practices, staff will develop a Final Plan for Final Polling.

Discussion

1. Signing: What signing will be used with the speed humps?
 - a. The City of Ann Arbor is currently testing a new approach to use pavement markings and yellow delineators placed in the lawn extension (to assist with snow plowing). If the new concrete treatment and curing protocol proves to be ineffective to keep pavement markings down, the team may revisit transitioning from pavement markings to signage.
2. Curb extensions: Are residents responsible for any maintenance or costs with curb extensions?
 - a. Residents adjacent to curb extensions will have to maintain the additional green space created. The cost to construct the device is paid for by the program. Street maintenance requests can be made through the A2 Fix-It app.

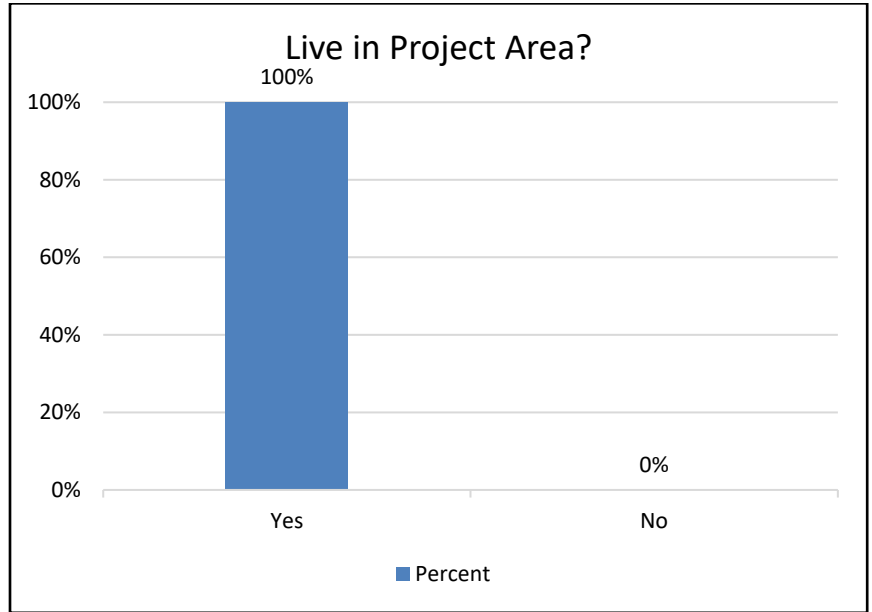

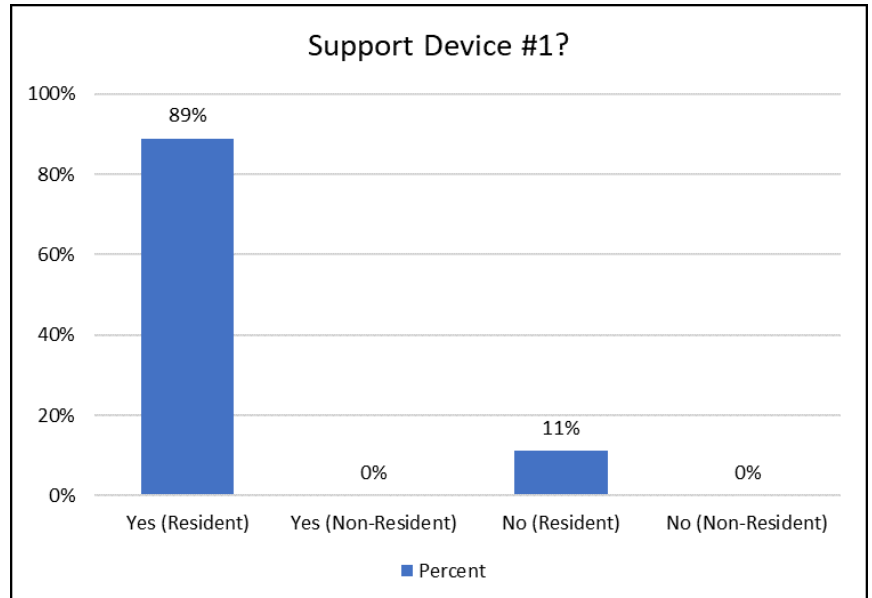

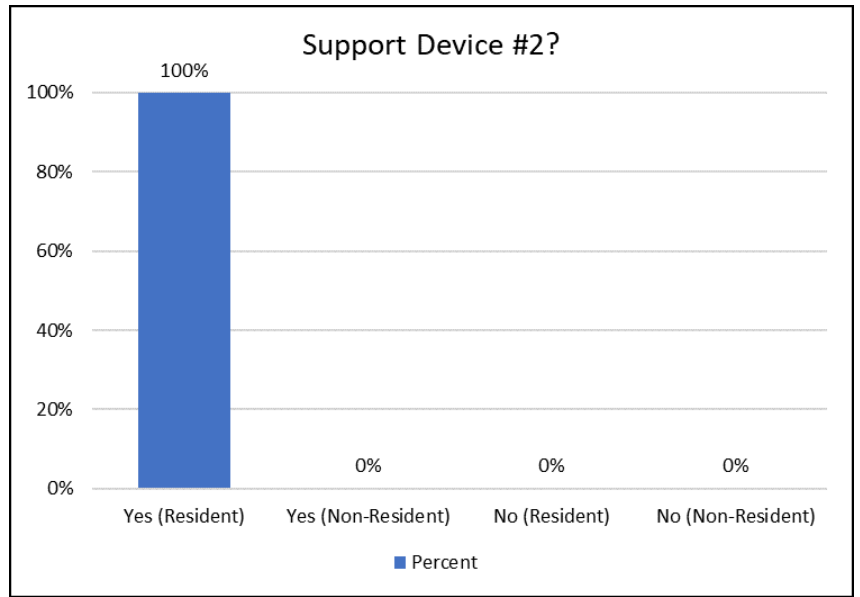
