Presidents Day. Ann Arbor municipal offices will be closed on Presidents Day, Monday, Feb. 17. Trash/recycling collection will continue as regularly scheduled, with no planned delays.

New City Flag for Sale. A new city flag is now flying outside of city buildings, and you can also "fly" the new flag! Two sizes are available for (in-person-only) purchase — a "parade" size for \$10 and a 4-foot- by 6-foot flag for \$65 — in the city clerk's office, second floor at Larcom City Hall. A FREE laptop sticker can also be picked up from the front counter of the city clerk's office. **City Launches A2 Engage Online Hub.** The City of Ann Arbor is launching <u>Engage Ann Arbor (EA2)</u>, a dynamic online hub designed to significantly improve how the city shares information and gathers input on projects and programs. More than a year in development, and in partnership with Social Pinpoint, this innovative platform marks a step forward in digital public engagement and transparency.

About Engage Ann Arbor (EA2)

<u>Engage Ann Arbor (EA2)</u> is a comprehensive online platform that provides residents with detailed, interactive insights into city projects and initiatives by leveraging tools such as data visualization, mapping and surveys. The city had been using similar tools in the past, and EA2 brings them all together, in one place, to enhance how the city communicates and collaborates with the community.

Features of EA2:

- Survey tools: Efficiently share your opinions and feedback on city initiatives.
- Data integration: Access a wide range of datasets relevant to ongoing projects.
- Engagement tools: Participate in discussions and stay informed about current and upcoming projects.
- Interactive maps: Explore project locations and affected areas with ease.

The features on the hub will be used based on the needs of the project, therefore not all projects will need the use of each.

The City of Ann Arbor is excited to expand EA2's reach, empowering residents with a new way to play an active role in projects and planning. EA2 will complement, not replace, the other ways the city interacts with the community, ultimately helping to ensure everyone can participate and be heard, effectively and as conveniently as possible.

Barton Dam Embankment Work and Public Access Restrictions to Begin in March 2025. Barton Dam construction work will begin in Ann Arbor in early March 2025. The dam is adjacent to Barton Pond, Barton Nature Area, Bird Hills Nature Area and trails to and along the Huron River.

Due to the construction project, public access within these areas will be restricted, including: North of the pedestrian bridge on the west side the railroad crossing; the right embankment including the canoe portage on Barton Pond; the spillway; and the left embankment. In addition, there will be no public on-site access to Barton Pond. The parking lot at Barton Nature Area will be available; however, the public is advised that the access drive, pathways and adjacent yard will be shared by construction operations and construction traffic. The pedestrian bridge over the Huron River and the city canoe launch downstream of the pedestrian bridge will be accessible. While there will be barricades and signage posted, the public using the Barton Nature Area is urged to remain cautious in the parking lot, pathway and other areas west of the Huron River. A map indicating restricted areas as well as areas that will be maintained for public access can be found on the city <u>dams and hydros webpage</u>. There is also potential for noise from equipment situated between the railroad tracks and the dam, as dewatering equipment must remain running 24 hours, seven days per week during key excavation work.

Visitors to this area are asked to comply with the safety restrictions, barricades and posted signage on site. The city is also taking this opportunity to issue a reminder that crossing railroad tracks beyond designated, posted access points is extremely hazardous and is against the law.

This work at Barton Dam is anticipated to be completed by June 2027 and will include stabilizing a berm on the downstream slope of the right embankment to address seepage and stability concerns. "These planned

improvements are necessary to ensure the operational reliability of this key infrastructure component and are required for Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) compliance," explained Ann Arbor Water Treatment Services Manager Molly Maciejewski. This project is included in the city's Capital Improvements Plan and will receive funding in the amount of \$2 million from the American Rescue Plan Act (<u>Resolution Enactment #R-24-280</u>). Additional work will include improving site access and other dam maintenance as required by FERC.

A2 Snow Match Program Pairs Volunteers with Neighbors in Need. Need assistance with managing snow and ice from sidewalks? Or, do you want to give back and make a difference in your community? The City of Ann Arbor has solutions for both! The city is helping residents prepare for winter weather, and the responsibilities that come with the ice and snow, with the launch of the 2024–25 <u>A2 Snow Match program</u>. Residents can sign up now for this season's A2 Snow Match — either as a volunteer or a recipient — to be paired with a nearby neighbor to assist, or to be assisted, with sidewalk snow removal.

Connect with City Staff and Officials at the 2025 Ann Arbor Community Academy. The Ann Arbor Community Academy (A2CA) is returning for its eighth year to provide a closeup look at local government. The popular program, free and open to community members 18 years of age and older, will again be conducted with a hybrid approach. Weekly sessions will be held either online or in person, 6:30–8:30 p.m. Wednesdays throughout March and April. In-person tours will take place on select Tuesdays with a separate signup, and on a first-come basis. More information on the in-person tours will be provided after participants sign up.

A2CA connects participants with city staff and officials to discover what goes into both long-term planning and day-to-day operations throughout Ann Arbor. <u>Registration is now open</u>! The deadline to register is Monday, Feb. 17, 2025. For details, visit <u>www.a2gov.org/A2CA</u>.
