Please provide the following guidelines to victims of IRS identity theft complaints:

1. Fill out IRS Identity Theft Affidavit Form 14039 and follow the instructions on the back.
2. File a report with the Federal Trade Commission www.identitytheft.gov or FTC Identity Theft Hotline at 1.877.438.4338.
3. Contact the Social Security Administration Fraud Hotline at 1.800.269.0271.
4. Contact and report the incident to the fraud departments of the three major credit reporting agencies.

Victims are advised to contact the below listed credit reporting agencies to place an alert on their name. Additionally, the victim should obtain/review their credit report to ensure that no other crimes have occurred utilizing their identity.
