Notes: The original house on this site was built by Dr. Charles B. Porter, a dentist, in the 1860s. The house appears on the 1866 birds-eye map. It was substantially remodeled by Burke A. & Mary A. Hinsdale in the 1890s. Hinsdale was a Professor of the Science and Art of Teaching at the University of Michigan from 1888 until his death in 1900. Previously he had been President of Hiram College and Superintendent of Schools in Cleveland. Hinsdale wrote many books on education and government, and is best remembered for his *History of the University of Michigan*, published posthumously in 1906. Mrs. Hinsdale remained in the house until 1916, and it became home to the Kappa Alpha Theta Sorority in 1918, who were responsible for the major remodeling and addition at that time, which gave it its classical appearance. The sorority still resides here.
