A2 Snow Match Program Pairs Volunteers with Neighbors in Need. Need assistance with managing snow and ice from sidewalks? Or, do you want to give back and make a difference in your community? The City of Ann Arbor has solutions for both! The city is helping residents prepare for winter weather, and the responsibilities that come with the ice and snow, with the launch of the 2024–25 <u>A2 Snow Match program</u>. Residents can sign up now for this season's A2 Snow Match — either as a volunteer or a recipient — to be paired with a nearby neighbor to assist, or to be assisted, with sidewalk snow removal.




