

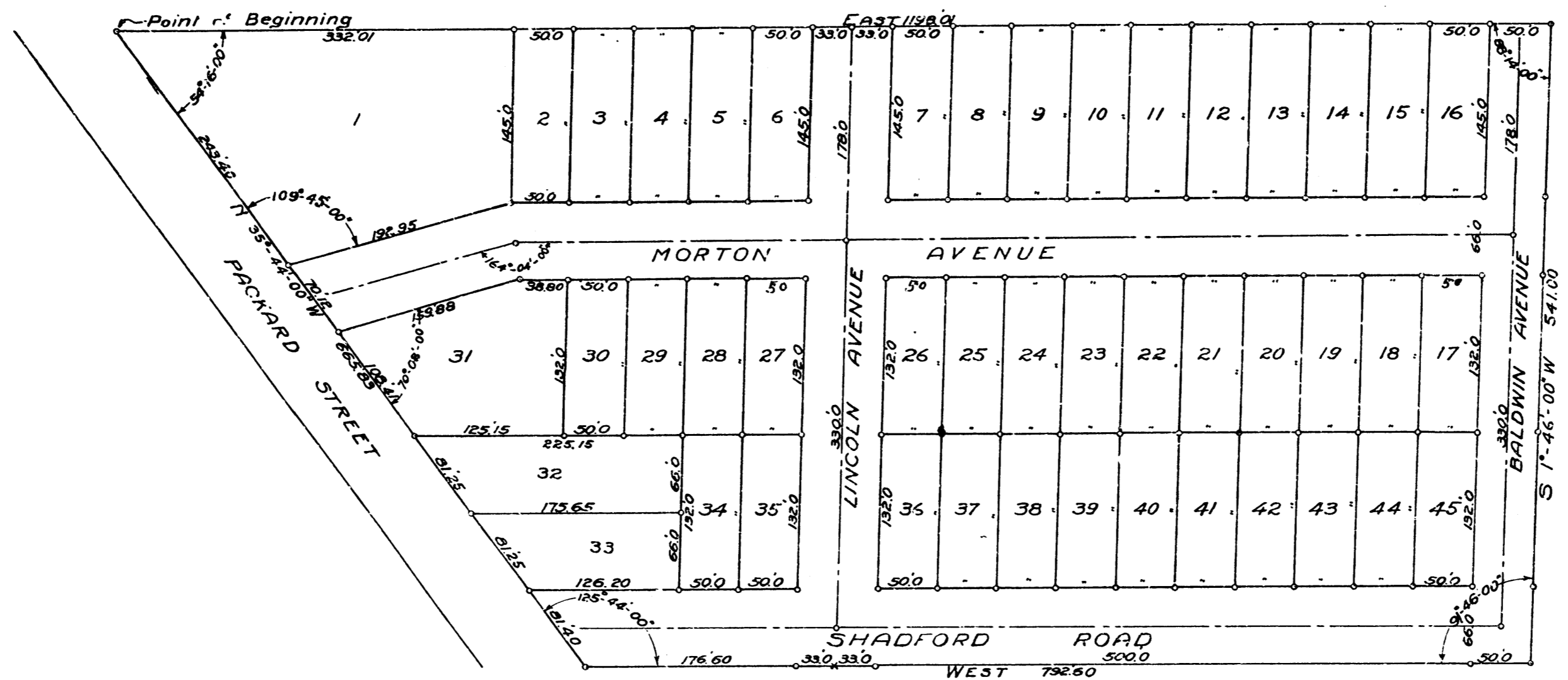

Note: This Plat is located on the South one-half of Section 33, T.2, S., R.6 E., Meridian of Michigan.
